

As an overall principle, it guides all education policies and practices, as education is basic human right and the foundation for a more just and equal society.



The aim of the school is to impart a sound, all round, education for the harmonious growth of the child so as to enable him/her to become a worthy citizen of this great land. The school lays special emphasis on Indian culture and moral education. It expects students to be fully equipped to face different challenges of life.

Rules and Regulations

1. The School diary published each year under the authority of the School, is an integral part of a student's life, hence it must be in the possession of every Student and he/she should carry it to the School every day.
2. The School has introduced Learning Management Systems (MCB) for all Academic Years which has facilitated streamlining the learning process by providing a central location for online access to school materials. Students and Parents must check their E-Mail, WhatsApp, MCB, and Class Walk ID regularly to access various School updates, notices, and circulars.
3. The School provides opportunities and encourages Students to appear in various competitive examinations conducted nationally and internationally, including but not limited to:
 - a) NTSE: National Talent Search Examination
 - b) SOF: Science Olympiad Foundation
 - c) KVPY: Kishore Vaigyanik Protsahan Yojana
 - d) TERI: The Energy Research Institute –Green Olympiad
 - e) IAPT: Indian Association of Physics Teachers
 - f) JBNSTS: Junior Scholarship Test
 - g) JBNSTS: Senior Scholarship Test
 - h) KAMP-CSIR: Knowledge and Awareness Mapping Platform.

4. The School encourages inclusive practices and believes in giving equal and adequate learning opportunities to all students including Children with Special Needs (CWSN). In this direction, the School has always provided Special Educators and Counsellors for creating an ambiance of inclusiveness as per CBSE guidelines/norms.
5. School fees need to be paid on time and part payment is not allowed. A Late Fee of Rs. 200/- per month will be applicable for delay in payment. Nonpayment of Fees within 30days from the last payment date, could result in the student's name being withdrawn from the school rolls. The Parent will have to reapply for admission to the School Management Committee, through the School Principal for approval. A re-admission Fee of 50% of the admission Fee will be applicable along with the School Fees in such cases once approved by the School Management Committee.
6. Parents must specify students details and payment information in the remarks section while using online mode. Late payments beyond the specified deadline even on weekends (Saturday or Sunday), will incur applicable late fine.
7. Non-negotiable adherence to all school-set deadlines, including payments and submissions.
8. The School Management Committee will review the School Fee yearly.
9. In the event of a student leaving the School before the completion of the session, the parent may apply to the School Principal to claim for pro-rata return of the tuition fee only.
10. School reserves the right to take photographs for the sake of documentation and records for various academic and co-scholastic activities.
11. All the students must extend cooperation in taking care of all the property of the School, and shall be required to abide by the following:
 - a) School property is to be handled with proper care and caution.
 - b) Students should not scratch or spoil the desks, benches, or chairs.
 - c) No student should damage the assets of the School (furniture/electrical items) or the belongings of others. Damage caused even by accident should be reported at once to the Class Teacher. The School reserves the right to recover the dues for expenses incurred towards this damage from the parent of the concerned ward.
 - d) The students should not write or draw anything on the walls/tables. Graffiti in any mannerism strictly prohibited.
12. Electronic gadgets including mobiles, i-pod, PlayStations, audio/video players, cameras, etc. are not permitted inside the School premises as per CBSE guidelines. If found, the articles will be confiscated and handed over to the parent. A repeat of the same offence may be viewed strictly and appropriate action may be initiated by the School Principal.
 - b) Unauthorised Photography/Videography is not allowed in the School.

13. Students should be neatly dressed in proper School uniform and immaculately turned out.
14. Spikes, long sideburns, coloured/streaked hair are not allowed for any Student.

15. Girls should abstain from applying nail polish, mehendi, and wearing fancy earrings.
16. Attendance is compulsory on the opening day after any vacation.
17. Mandatory 80% attendance; failure to comply may result in academic consequences.
18. Students are not permitted to enter their class after a day's leave without the sanction of the Principal if a letter stating the reason for leave from parents is not presented.
19. If Students remain absent for more than three consecutive days on medical grounds, he/she must submit a leave letter addressed to the Principal citing the reason for absence and must attach a medical certificate issued by a practicing doctor, if applicable.
20. Students who are absent for more than a week will not be permitted to attend school without the Parents accompanying the Student and meeting the School Principal, along with evidence/supporting documents showing reasons for such absenteeism.
21. Students will be marked late in his/her diary in case of late entry to School. On being late for three days in the same month the parents will be informed by the office staff and the Student would be permitted to attend School post a face-to-face meeting between the Parents and the School Principal.
22. Students are not allowed to bring gifts or sweets for staffs or teachers on any occasion.
23. Student is not permitted to appear for tests/grades if he/she does not stay for the entire duration of School hours. If the Student is fit to give a test, he /she can manage to attend full School.
24. Students shall not resort to unfair means during examinations. Rules, regulations, and/or guidelines as prescribed by CBSE from time to time shall be applied for all cases of unfair means.
25. No books, periodicals or newspapers, pen drives, CDs/DVDs etc. of an objectionable nature should be brought to School.
26. The School campus and the Classrooms are to be kept clean. Students at all times must use the dust bins to throw trash/waste.
27. It is mandatory for all Students to use the demarcated washrooms for Boys and Girls and practice good hygiene habits during School hours.
28. Use of abusive language or improper behaviour such as whistling or shouting is not permitted on the School premises.
29. The School follows a strict policy of **NO BULLYING**.
30. Students cannot burst crackers or splash colours within the School.
31. Upon emergency, the Students may be permitted to use/attend office telephone with the prior permission of the Office-in-charge.
32. Parents should regularly monitor the online and offline usage of technology by their kids to inculcate cyber discipline and appropriate behavior.

- 33. Parents should attend the School PTM's or any other meetings as called for by the Class teacher, coordinator, or Principal to help as partners towards the child's development and needs.
- 34. Parents should refrain from entering the classrooms during working hours & taking their wards half day / or for early leave as it leads to a direct impact on the student's academics and progress.
- 35. Parents can convey their concerns to School through Almanac or email to the respective class teachers. The concern can be escalated to the coordinator/Vice Principal / Principal if not resolved at the appropriate level. Parent may give 72 hours at each level for the respective staff to look into and resolve the concern.
- 36. Parents are to inform changes in address or phone number to School through a diary for correction in School records.
- 37. Parents can meet the teachers or the staff through prior appointments and after schooling hours only.
- 38. Release of students of Class Nursery to Grade II will happen only after receiving the Release card keeping in mind the safety of the student. For all Students of other grades, the School reserves the right to verify the credentials of the Parents and/or guardians who pick up or drop the children to and from the School premises.
- 39. It is mandatory for the Parent to inform the Principal via e-mail that in his/her/their absence she shall be the active guardian of the Student. Guardian shall abide by all Rules and Regulations as laid down herein for and on behalf of the Parents.
- 40. Application for Transfer Certificate needs to be submitted on or before the 5th day of the first two quarters failing which the fee applicable for the whole quarter shall be payable by the Parent for issuing the Transfer Certificate. Transfer Certificate application received in the third or fourth quarter will lead to a full year's Fee payment.
- 41. Tiffin must be carried by the student only. If the tiffin is being sent with a parent or an authorised rep on behalf of the parent, then it must carry a letter signed by the parent, informing the same.
- 42. Strict adherence to a no-messy-food in lunchboxes.
- 43. Parents should ensure that Students are not permitted to drive any motorized two-wheeler or four-wheeler to and from School/under any circumstances whatso-ever till a valid license is obtained from the relevant authorities.
- 44. Parents need to collect all information about the Transport Service Providers to ensure their ward's safety.
- 45. Prohibition of road parking during pick up/drop-off. Parents must utilise the dedicated parking area.
- 46. In case of any non-compliance with the School Rules and Regulations by the students and/or the parents, as listed here or on the admission form or on the school website, the School reserves the right to take such action as it may deem fit and

proper without any further recourse.

GENERAL INFORMATION

School fees are payable on a quarterly basis in the months of April, July, October and January of the current academic year. Fees for the quarter are to be deposited through online mode only.

Fees for 1st Quarter - April to June - payable during 1st to 30th of April.

Fees for 2nd Quarter - July to September - payable during 1st to 15th of July.

Fees for 3rd Quarter- October to December - payable during 1st to 15th of October.

Fees for 4th Quarter - January to March - payable during 1st to 15th of January.

Parent to pay fees through MCB (Apeejay school app).

Default in payment of Fees

Parents are requested to avoid defaulting fee payment. A late fee of Rs.200/- will be applied for each month the fee payment remains in default. This late fee will be charged on a monthly basis and will continue to accrue until the full payment, including any applicable late fees, is settled. School fees are required to be paid in its entirety (under all heads will be applicable). Part payment is not accepted and is liable to attract late fee charges. The default fee along with the late fine is to be deposited through online mode.

Scheme of Studies:

Nursery - Upper K.G.

As per NEP 2020 (paragraph 1.6.) the Early Childhood and Education (ECCE) initiative introduces the concept of “Balvatika”. This one-year preparatory program, implemented before LKG, is designed to equip children under the age of five with cognitive and linguistic skills essential for reading, writing, and developing numerical understanding. Led by ECCE qualified teachers, the Balvatika program adopts a play-based approach. NCERT has established guidelines for Balvatika and initial three years of pre-school education, emphasizing a foundational educational framework for early childhood development. There is no formal education in this section. The primary aim in this stage is to help socialize the child and help her/him in acquiring good disciplined personal habits and to introduce her/him to letters and numbers.

Classes I to X

The following subjects are taught in the above classes:

English, Hindi/Bengali, Mathematics, Science, Social Science, Work Experience/ Computers, Art Education, Physical and Health Education/Yoga, Moral Science Life Skill and AI (For classes VIII &IX)

Hindi, Bengali are also being offered as third language for classes VI-VIII.

Computer Education is compulsory for all students of class I- X (Work Experience).

School Library:

Apeejay Anand children's Library is a happening place where the creative, intellectual and imaginative, and earnest minds meet and create a vibrant atmosphere of learning, sharing and expressing and all the while evolving. These minds are young and ebullient, eager and curious. This holistic space has become the centre of activities for regular school children and the under privileged children of Apeejay Anand Children's Library.

The library is not only the store house of books of varied genre and subjects used for edification of students and teachers but disseminates knowledge through the numerous boards placed at strategic points. children of all classes visit library in the periods allotted to them in the company of the teachers to read books of their choice. Senior students and teachers avail the facility of reference material and resource books for supplementing their studies.

The differently abled children are catered through a well-designed and curated programme that touches upon many aspects of their development. Art and craft, Puppetry, Storytelling, Hindi teaching, Music, Dance, yoga, fine arts have been taught on a regular basis. Each one Teach One programme where both regular and economically challenged students collaborate and interact gives rise to a fun filled and unique teaching learning situation. All these recreational activities proved to be beneficial as they have grown to be more confident and involved
